**Friends of PACAPE,**

There is a lot going on around the Commonwealth and regarding the Federal Tax Credit. We are all looking for an indication of whether Governor Schapiro will opt in to the program. We are working to update you on some of the things that are happening in our state and around the country.

Here are some news items that you might find helpful:

1. **Safety Grant Announcement:** PCCD has just released the Private School Safety Grant. We are expecting the due date to be March 30 if our reports are correct. Look for that information soon on the PCCD website. To clarify- these are different from the non-profit safety grants that came out earlier in December. **A reminder that** PACAPE has secured two high quality sponsors who provide amazing services and will help you with managing the grant process. They are:
  - a. The **Critical Response Group** who provide mapping services for school buildings to interface with emergency protective services.   - b. The **Convoy Group** provide facility security assessments, training and resources that are all eligible for PCCD Grants. 2. **The Federal Tax Credit.** We hosted a meeting of PA coalition team members in December to talk more about how to strategize ways to encourage the Governor to opt into the credit as soon as possible. Since then there has been a lot of information generated around the country. Here are some highlights of that activity:
  - a. **Governor Shapiro has not made a decision to opt-in** to the Federal Tax Credit at this time.
  - b. **Informal National Opt-In Scorecard from Mark Gleason-** If we include D.C., there are 19 states that have not made an indication yet. Of these, 17 have Democratic governors and 11 have Democratic trifectas (Governor/Senate/House). Six of these including Pennsylvania have a divided legislature. One state (Vermont) has a Republican governor and a divided legislature.
  - c. **Comments from Shapiro:**
    - i. For now, most Democratic governors seem [content to wait](#) for the IRS rules. As a spokesperson for Pennsylvania Gov. Josh Shapiro put it in an email: "The Shapiro Administration is awaiting federal guidance to address key questions about how this program would work, including which students will be eligible, how this federal initiative will interact with existing programs, and more.   - d. **A collection of Media and Activities from Nate Benefield at Commonwealth Foundation:** A few updates on activities and media hits around the federal scholarship tax credit:

- ii. The Pa House Republican Policy Committee [held a hearing last week](#) on educational choice and the federal tax credit scholarship (we testified, as did AFC, and Keisha from CSFP). Following that, Rep. Martina White [called for Shapiro to opt in](#).
- iii. My colleague Megan had a [piece in Real Clear PA](#) about what Pennsylvania needs to do to retake its status as a leaders in educational choice:
